

## VANDERBILT DRAWINGS.

### Locomobile Will Be First to Start in Big Cup Race.

In the drawings for positions in the Vanderbilt race at the Garden City Hotel last evening the post of honor—first car to start—was won by the Locomobile, for which no driver has been named as yet. Charles Basle, in the Knox, got second place, and Emil Stricker, to drive Robert Graves's Mercedes, third place. Nineteen cars were drawn, the Mora entry, the first named for the race, being withdrawn on account of the inability of the factory to complete the car in time.

The meeting was attended by a number of the owners of the cars entered, and was presided over by Chairman Thompson of the Vanderbilt Cup Commission. Fred Wagner conducted the drawings and will have the general direction of the drivers during the preliminaries of the race. The weighing will take place at Bray's, Garden City, at 9 o'clock on next Wednesday morning, while the daily practice will continue between dawn and 7 o'clock each morning until the race.
